

Know your neighbor





If you live in Chillicothe, you likely have a personal story about the Crosskeys Tavern on East Main. Maybe you visited for the music, for a meal, for a pub crawl or even on a paranormal tour. The building has held several popular taverns, restaurants and clubs in its long history including Sons Bar and Grill, and Club 19. Tom Burke opened it as the Crosskeys Tavern with Dale Perry and Charles Van De Carr on St. Patrick's Day in 1973. Regardless of the name, it has always been a place for music, food and comradery. Jazz legend Nancy Wilson played there when it was Club 19 before heading to New York to become a legend. And one of the oldest Dixieland jazz bands in the country, The Goosetown Astonishers, recently celebrated 50 years playing at the CrossKeys Tavern, forming when Burke opened the doors.

Beckie Schaeffer has heard all of the stories. Beckie grew up in the restaurant/bar industry, her parents owned these types of businesses. She began working in a restaurant in Waverly at the age of 15. Later she moved to Florida where she went to bartending school and received her Mixology Certificate. After graduating, she came back to Waverly to begin working again. In 1996, Tom Burke hired her to work in Crawdaddys, located in the back of Crosskeys. Within six months she was promoted to manage Crawdaddys, and after that quickly moved up in management to the front of the house, Crosskeys. After the death of Tom Burke, Beckie and her husband Larry bought the building and the business and have now owned them for three years.

In September of last year, Beckie told the Chillicothe Gazette, "My goal in this business is to make everyone feel welcomed and happy. Give everyone a place to feel at home and safe. Serve great food and give great smiles and attention to our patrons. We get very involved with our regulars and think of them as family."

She accomplishes this goal every day.

While this is a beloved long-standing business, it's not without its challenges. Tom Burke always taught her that helping the rest of the downtown businesses is what they should always do and what they were here to do. She shared that the biggest opportunity for the downtown is to clarify the roles of the different supporting organizations so local businesses understand the resources available to them, especially as it relates to promoting and advertising events, hours and menus. If you didn't know, Crosskeys has a full kitchen, so stop in and grab dinner while they are open. In addition to food, Crosskeys has pool tables, darts and soft darts.

If you don't have a memory or story at the Crosskeys Tavern, there's no better time than the present to make one!
