When we think of downtown 10 years ago, there were a few businesses that are still mainstays, but there wasn't a big growth spurt of small businesses.....yet. Local artists and entrepreneurs were seeing the potential. One such artist was Courtney Lewis. She was working as a web designer and had started a t-shirt company, Paper City Co., on the side offering fun retro Chillicothe shirts showcasing beloved historical businesses like Skate Away, Sherman Haus, and Johnny's Chicken.

She watched what was happening downtown and wanted to be part of it. She talked to Ed Kunzelman and became more and more convinced she could do it. She could open her own brick and mortar business.

"I saw the potential of downtown and wanted to build something to show people it can happen here," said Lewis. "I wanted to show there was pride in Chillicothe, pride in being from here."

She opened Totem on Second Street November 8, 2013 and featured her retro t-shirts, along with other unique Chillicothe-branded items and specialty retail.

"Courtney was instrumental in helping Second Street get started and fueling excitement for Downtown," said Ben Daughters, Downtown Chillicothe Board President.

Fast forward to 2022. After making it through all of the business challenges of the COVID pandemic, Courtney did some soul-searching and realized that she was ready for some changes in her life. Circumstances and costs had changed and she had to make a decision on whether to keep Totem open or not.

"I put so much passion into this business and it was such a hard decision," said Courtney of finally deciding to move onward, "I felt like I was losing a friend."

Courtney can currently be found at the Chillicothe and Ross Public Library as their Communications and Marketing Manager. She pays close attention to what is happening downtown and is excited to see the engagement. Her marketing hat sees continued opportunities to promote growth, new businesses and downtown events.


"Courtney planted a seed in downtown to grow a garden," said Liz Gibbons-Camp.
