Often regarded as a universal symbol for hospitality and tourism, the pineapple is the perfect award for those recognized at the Ross-Chillicothe Convention and Visitor's Bureau annual awards banquet.

This year's event, held on May 8 at the Christopher Inn Conference Center, recognized individuals in Chillicothe dedicated to going above and beyond the job task in the hospitality and tourism industries.


